

Six Priorities of the Minister of Interior

1. Training and Education

- All new police recruits must pass basic training
- **Development of short-term professional courses in-country.**
- **Ongoing continuity training within police units.**
- **Sending students, trainers and other police personnel out of country for training.**
- **Foreigners and 'Foreign-trained' trainers to carry out courses in-country**

2. Leadership development

- **A program to assess and develop the potential of current and future leaders**
- **Courses at all levels up to Deputy Minister to develop leadership and management skills and other core competencies**
- **A policy of rotation so that senior officers have a general experience, whilst allowing for a degree of specialization**

3. Fighting Corruption

- **Transparency and accountability in contracting**
- **Appointments made on merit-based principle and competencies, with no ethnic discrimination**
- **A code of conduct and ethics training for police**

4. Promoting quality living conditions and working conditions

- **Improvement of living and working conditions in offices and checkpoints**
- **Improvement of police equipment such as weapons, uniform, radios, availability of vehicles etc**
- **Improvement of professional appearance of police**
- **Improvement of police living quarters and provision of police-housing**

5. Review and Reform of Tashkil

6. Development of a recognition and discipline system (reward and punishment)

- **Promotion and reward of personnel for their good work.**
- **Disciplining and penalizing personnel according to the law when they misuse authority or fail in their duties**
- **Making commanders take responsibility**
